Dear Councilors,

Clark County Citizens United, Inc. is forwarding you a video Conference of the Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission. That agency is a volunteer state agency, that oversees fishing, hunting and shell fish. Please note that one of the members is Dr. Don McIssac. In 2015 Dr. McIsaac volunteered to help author Alternative 4, for the 2016 Comprehensive Plan.

During the planning phase, CCCU was told by the Clark County Commissioners/Council to meet with Clark County Planning Staff to determine what should be included in another Alternative, along with Alt 1, 2 and 3, to the proposed Plan.

After four meetings, staff told CCCU if they wanted another alternative, they had to write it themselves. CCCU Board members were alerted about the mandate, and Dr. McIsaac volunteered to help. He was quite familiar with such policy writing processes, and Alternative 4 was created. It was then forwarded to the Councilors for consideration, and after some changes, became the proposed Alternative 4, for the 2016 Clark County Comprehensive Plan.


In December of 2015, Alternative 4 was adopted by a majority of the Clark County Council Board. But when two new members were added to the Board in 2016, the adopted Alternative was quickly repealed by that majority Board. CCCU believes Alternative 4 was the best approach to the housing shortage crisis that Clark County Planning pushed the county into. Dr. McIsaac was right, Clark County Citizens United, Inc. was right, the 2015 Councilors were right, and Clark County staff was wrong. Alternative 4 must be reconsidered for adoption, in the next update of the Clark County Comprehensive Plan.
