My association, employers, and housing providers throughout the community are concerned with the current middle population forecast and associated average annual growth of 1.26%

Per the U.S. Census numbers within the presentation attached, from 2010-2020 the county grew at an average annual rate of 1.7%. Also, OFM provided a snapshot of growth from April  $1^{st}$  2012- April  $1^{st}$  2022(see attached) the average annual growth equates to over 2%. Please take this data into consideration when recommending a population forecast and associated average annual growth rate.










### Historical Annual Growth Rate - OFM







### A Comparison of Historic Population and Five OFM Population Projections

The year associated with each projection is the year it was published.









## Population Projection

- RCW 43.62.035 requires the State Office of Financial Management (OFM) to prepare 20- year population projections for each Growth Management county in high, middle and low scenarios.
- Clark County's 2045 population projections are:

High = 791,809 (1.51%)

Middle = 698,416 (1.26%)


Low = 576,151 (0.60%)

Percentages represent average annual growth rates. They use the starting population estimate from 2025 and were calculated using the formula for Compounded Annual Rate of Growth (CAGR).


• RCW 36.70A.110 and RCW 36.70A.115 directs County officials to select the county planning target; then within each county, population planning targets are collaboratively developed for all cities, towns, and unincorporated areas as part of the city and county planning process.




## 2022 OFM Population Forecast for Clark County








## Components of Population Change: Births, Deaths, Migration

## HB 1220 Overview

The Bill required Department of Commerce to provide the following four elements:


- Projected housing needs for all economic segments of the population (moderate, low, very low and extremely low income). Projections will be provided at the county level and must be incorporated into local planning efforts. This includes projected need for emergency housing, emergency shelters and permanent supportive housing. (Linked to Population Forecast)
- Guidance on provisions for moderate density housing options within an Urban Growth Area (UGA), including but not limited to duplexes, triplexes and townhomes. (Housing Options Study)
- Guidance on reviewing for adequate housing for existing and projected needs for all economic segments of the community, including sufficient land capacity for all projected housing. This includes guidance on how to assess zoning and regulations to allow, encourage and incentivize housing to meet the projected housing needs in each income band. (Expansion of VBLM)
- Guidance on examining racially disparate impacts, displacement and exclusion in housing policies and regulations, and recommended policies to address them. (Additional analysis)




