Dear Clark County Planning Commission:

Alliance for Community Engagement SWWA (ACE) is a coalition of environmental and social justice organizations who advocate for climate and resiliency policy in Clark County. ACE supports Clark County adopting the “MIDDLE” population projection of 698,416, as estimated by the Office of Financial Management on December 20, 2022. In accordance with RCW 43.62.035, the Middle range represents OFM’s estimate of the county’s most likely population.¹

ACE is concerned with the resiliency of Clark County communities in the face of climate impacts. Clark County faces challenges including air pollution; affordable housing; disproportionate health impacts for already overburdened community members; protection of farmland and local food systems; increased flooding, droughts, and heat waves along with wildfire risks; decreased stream volumes and water supply; loss of open spaces; harmful over-development; lack of multi-modal transportation; and traffic congestion.

According to the Clark County Community Planning Staff report dated 4/18/2023, Urban Growth Areas (UGAs)

“are sized in accordance with the adopted population forecast, choosing a forecast that significantly underestimates population growth can lead to UGAs that are too small, a shortage of developable land and upward pressure on housing and land prices. Alternatively, the GMA requires local governments to develop detailed funding plans for urban services, selecting a range that is too high can result in excessive and wasteful infrastructure spending.”

ACE believes it makes sense to follow OFM’s lead on this and adopt the “MIDDLE” population projection. This realistic estimate will help conserve resources and contain sprawl. It will also protect the general health, safety, and well-being of Clark County communities.
