Comment

I would urge you to adopt the middle population projection the state provided. It's the projection the state recommends and is fact based. I think it's important that you not adopt the higher projection, predominantly because of climate related concerns. Projecting a higher population increase would tempt the county into expanding more rapidly than is necessary. Climate concerns dictate that county government plan to keep expansion as limited as possible while still accommodating housing needs. Less outward expansion means fewer vehicle miles travelled and allows the county to concentrate services. There's no reason to over expand.
