Thank you for your work creating a Public Participation Plan. This is a first step in an important process to incorporate a climate element into your Comprehensive Plan update, as state law mandates. This process will affect our collective future.

Will it be business as usual for Clark County? From the letters submitted to you, it's clear that fossil fuel interests and other powerful industries are hoping so.

We have serious concerns about representatives from the fossil fuel industry and other industries who have vested interests in slowing our transition to a genuinely clean energy economy.
