To Climate Project facilitators.

For the record: Your instructions to the Climate Project community members includes "Bring concerns and ideas up for discussion at the earliest point in the process"

My early concerns:

- 1. We need to establish what it means to *reduce greenhouse gas emissions*. If the county replaces one gas boiler with an electric heat pump system, they have reduced emissions from one building. But if at the same time, 2 new buildings are permitted with gas boilers, our net community wide emissions may have increased.
- 2. We need to know how the greenhouse gas inventory is done.
- 3. We need to establish targets for greenhouse gas emissions reduction similar to or better than the state targets. State law says:
- (ii) By <u>2030</u>, reduce overall emissions of greenhouse gases in the state to <u>fifty</u> <u>million metric tons</u>, <u>or forty-five</u> percent below 1990 levels;
- (iii) By 2040, reduce overall emissions of greenhouse gases in the state to twentyseven million metric tons, or seventy percent below 1990 levels;
- (iv) By 2050, reduce overall emissions of greenhouse gases in the state to five million metric tons, or ninety-five percent below 1990 levels.

Currently, Washington State emissions are about 5% above 1990 levels.
