My biggest concerns have to do with housing density, road width, # of parking spaces for each dwelling & maintaining green spaces & tree canopy to reduce effects of warming.

I don't like how narrow streets are being built now. I understand it is supposed to cut down on speeding but in a populated neighborhood where people need to park on both sides of the street, the narrow channel leads to dangerous situations.

When housing developments are designed & planned they need to include at least 2 parking places - contiguous to dwelling, for residents. It doesn't have to be a garage, but people need to park close to the entrances to their dwellings. In addition to the space minimum, additional parking also needs to be planned.

Each new development needs to have trees & other vegetation to help with heat & cooling.
