Our expectation is that they can provide feedback to us about how feasible it would be for the county to implement policies relevant to their agency/department based on things like: what type of barriers/challenges they are aware of that may prevent them from being able to implement a policy, if their team would have the authority to implement a policy, or if they would need additional resources/staff.
