I'm wondering about the CAG having participated in a survey, apparently related to the LONG list of GHG Reduction Goal and Policy List. or ??

I've been reviewing the list with the comments (yes, i printed it out).

Why would EJC not be afforded the same opportunity as the CAG? Or did we miss something? May we at least have a copy of the survey? Curious about the equity and inclusion lens, including about the process.

AS for our FFJN workplan, I've been working on combining the 3 surveys into one, and trying to be relevant ... not too redundant, relatively short, and somewhat pertinent to Food and Farm Justice Network interests. I'm compromising with the County phase 2-4 surveys, to try to be cross-walkable with other input... Even tho' much seems moot given the list of Policies and Goals... The long Tables in Phase 2 and 4 are similar and redundant (which is good for scoring in terms of ideas that help Resilience AND GHG Reductions).

I've also reviewed a couple other plans (Whatcom County 2021), equity reports (Front and Center's Climate justice strategies 2020), and am considering submitting and/or sharing. Whatcom is not an urban county, from what I can tell, but it's a great presentation and super interesting graphics.

My general and place-holder comment on the overall list, is that it seems a bit scattered and piecemeal, rather than "comprehensive." We have very educated "brains" for brainstorming, but it feels like we're reinventing some wheels. On the other hand, Clark County likes to own it's own. Where we create goals and policies, AND the fact that we will likely align with existing goals and policies, AND also be analyzable... great work.
