- Plant-based treaty, which is a set of initiatives aiming to put food systems at the forefront of combating the climate crisis: https://plantbasedtreaty.org/the-pbt/#redirect
- Plant-based by defaults (included in the treaty): where institutions or governments spend the majority of their budget on climate friendly foods for their events

- Veganuary: the 31-day challenge to try eating more plant-based which can be with just County staff, or a call-to-action for all residents.

Adoption Process

 2025: Members of the public will have the opportunity to submit comments or testify to the Planning Commission and County Council about the county's proposed climate chapter for the Comprehensive Growth Management Plan.
