Hello, I'd like to submit comment for consideration at the 2/26/25 Clark County Climate Community Advisory Group (CAG) Meeting. I am a Clark County rural homeowner and I'd like to submit my support for FOCC's requested changes to the draft Goals and Policies. Please modify the CAG's draft Ecological Stewardship policy (G11, P2) to "Make a forest and tree preservation plan to protect forests and trees from damage or removal by development, mining, and wildfire in alignment with best practices and relevant state and federal laws." I am especially concerned about deforestation due to the many surface mining overlay site specific requests in the Comp Plan Update. I believe that opening the mining overlays will be a backdoor into future mining or development of some very significant timber. There is currently no evidence that we even need to expand mining in our county. The last update to the mining plan was over 10 years ago and it would be incredibly short sighted to even consider approving site specific mining requests without studying the impacts to our climate and environment.
