I don't like the way Vancouver/Clark County is going - I don't want it to be New York City! We are encouraging extreme growth by continually building- especially housing for the homeless which we are attracting from ALL STATES. YES, by all means we need to take care of LOCAL homeless and get them every service that the NEED - but we can't keep encouraging out of state homeless to come here because we pamper them. Sort them, identify them, help the local ones and the rest: SEND THEM BACK to their states of origin. Also, we can't keep destroying our natural areas to support illegal aliens. SEND THEM BACK as well. PROTECT what is UNIQUELY ours - our trees and bioregions which, when gone, are gone forever. I'm okay with concentrating population - but the RIVER is also a bioregion and we need NO MORE than "mile development, mile natural" in order to sustain the health of the river. We do NOT need to allow polluting industries on the river. It is our GEM. And I hate to see lovely old houses with exquisite, mature gardens being torn down to build ugly, rectangular buildings that benefit mostly the developers. WE NEED TREE PROTECTION. NO development should be curb to curb. EVERY development should allow 20% of the land to sustain trees and local vegetation. Away from the river go as high as you want, but LEAVE some trees and natural grass and flowers, so we can retain our ability to CLEAN the air and water and sustain native wildlife (all the way down to the bugs). For the new development provide very efficient public transportation (it takes me 1hr 15 minutes to get from Camas to Vancouver on the bus - too long for a daily commute to a job!) and make it clear that these newcomers must not own a car (like NYC) but travel by public/alternate transportation - this can all be accomplished by careful city planning so there are grocery stores and services amid the housing. Mixed use.
