Therefore, I support maintaining all agricultural lands designations at the current levels. It looks like all cities already have enough room for housing and expansion within the current UGA's. Ridgefield and La Center should not be able to expand into the agricultural lands.

I support the vision of the Friends of Clark County and the Clark County Advisory Group. I urge you to follow their recommendations. Also, it is not ok to miss the Dec. 31 deadline. This will reduce Clark County's ability to access funding.
