•	 The availability of public facilities, including roads used in transporting agricultural products; Tax status, including whether lands are enrolled under the current use tax assessment under chapter 84.34 RCW; The availability of public services; Relationship or proximity to urban growth areas; Land use settlement patterns and their compatibility with agricultural practices; Predominant parcel size, which may include smaller parcels if contiguous with other agricultural resource lands; Intensity of nearby land uses; History of land development permits issued nearby; Land values under alternative uses; and Proximity to markets.
