- Learn how the CCAP will be used in the state of Washington and about the next steps

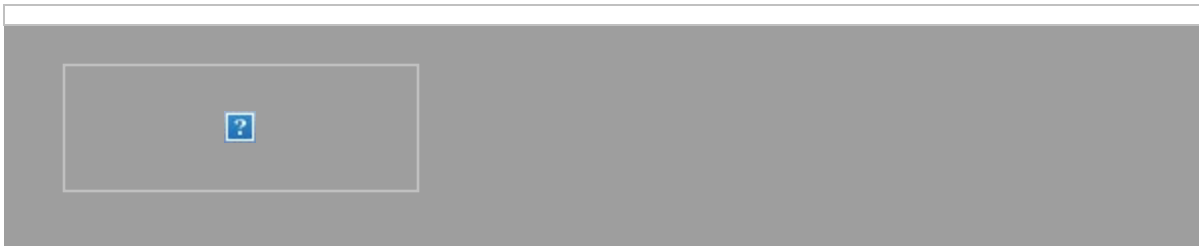
