Subject: Implementation of SB 5820: Formal Request to Update County Ordinances and Comprehensive Plan

Dear Chair Marshall, Councilors, and County Manager,

Following the recent passage and signing of **SB 5820** by Governor Ferguson, I am writing to formally inquire about the timeline and process for removing references to **Freight Rail Dependent Uses (FRDU)** from our current county ordinances and the Comprehensive Plan.

With the new legislative framework now in place, it is my understanding that the Council holds the authority to direct staff to begin the necessary "cleanup" of these documents. To ensure the county remains proactive and aligned with state law, We recommend the following specific amendments to remove the legacy of FRDU (CPZ 2017-00027):

Recommended Amendments

- **Ordinance 2018-01-01: ***
 - Delete "Whereas" paragraphs 5 through 12.
 - Remove all references to "CPZ 2017-00027" in "Whereas" paragraph 15 and Section (3)(11).
- **Comprehensive Plan Update: ***
 - Strike all references to FRDU currently located in **§3.8**
 - Delete Reference to FRDU on page 38 of Comp Plan
 - Delete reference to FRDU on page 130—from "On the lower 14 miles...Clark County"
 - Delete overlays on Zoning and Comprehensive Plan Maps
 - Delete RailRoad Industrial Overlay from the Comp Plan (p 38) and from Table 1.6 on page 32 and from the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Maps—as the overlay is predominantly on Agricultural Lands of Long-Term Commercial Significance (ALLTCS).

These deletions should be part of the final 2025 Comprehensive Plan. It is essential that any references to the FRDU should NOT be included in the Update.

Timely action is essential to ensure our local planning documents accurately reflect the current legal landscape and the needs of our community. I look forward to hearing your thoughts on the proposed timeline for these updates and how the Council intends to direct staff to proceed.

We have attached a proposed policy that we strongly recommend and support.

Thank you for your time and for your dedication to our county.
