Seth,

Due to the timing of these submittals, the changes will not be reflected as part of the clean-up efforts related to the Arterial Atlas for the upcoming work sessions and hearings with Planning Commission and County Council.

However, we would like to offer this option for moving these requests forward as a Docket agenda item:

We would like to process these requests as part of the 2026/27 Docket agenda. We will identify Docket items in the fall of 2026, review/process them in 2027 with changes going into effect in January 2028.

This approach will enable us enough time to research these alignments, pull the related land use decisions, and make sure we are not recommending changes to Council that conflict with other historic decisions without a full understanding of what has transpired.

I wanted to assure you that your request has been heard, but we just don't have the time to process it as part of the comp plan update effort currently wrapping up.

I am happy to assist you.

We are currently working to update the Clark County Comp Plan, which includes updating the Arterial Atlas.

The 2020 adopted Arterial Atlas can be found via MapsOnline, here: [MapsOnline, Clark County WA. GIS](#). This is the most current version of the Arterial Atlas.

We are waiting on Metro to finish running the regional transportation model based on the preferred land use alternative, set by County Council on April 28th. Metro/RTC should complete the model work by the end of June. At that time, staff will work with our consultants to identify any changes that need to be made to the Arterial Atlas.

Please email us any requested changes to the Arterial Atlas. Include enough detail for us to understand the full request and contact information in case we have questions. There is no guarantee that requests will result in the desired changes. There is also no guarantee that a project shown in the Arterial Atlas will be included in the county's 20-yr CFP.

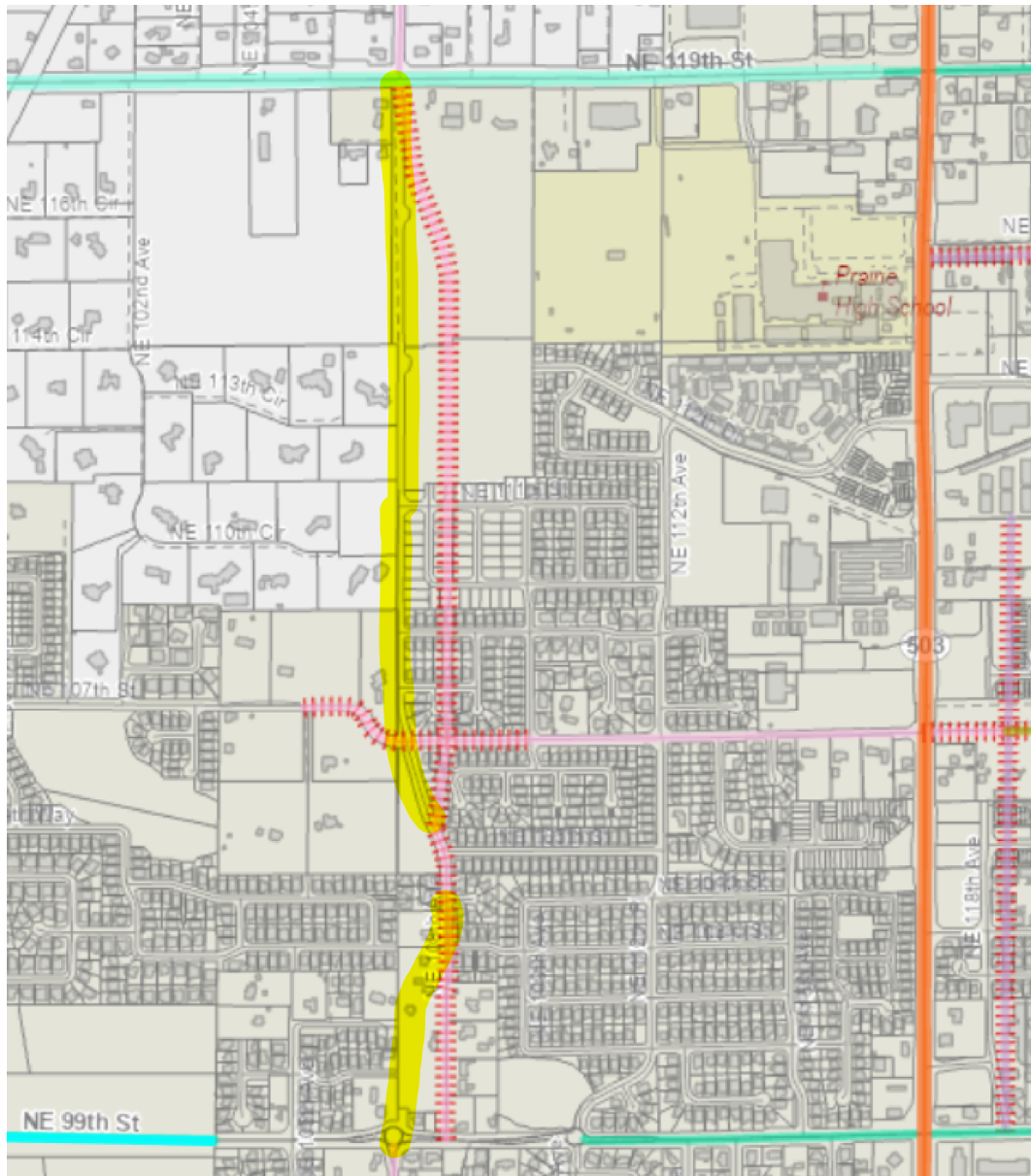

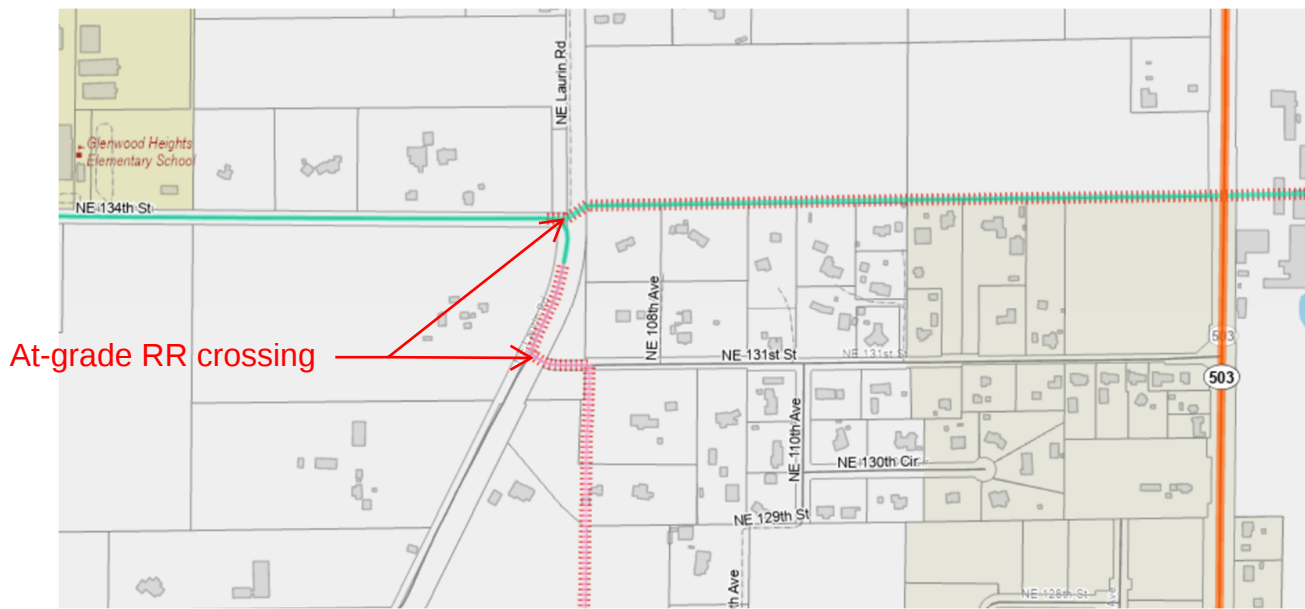
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Memo: Updates to the Clark County Arterial Atlas

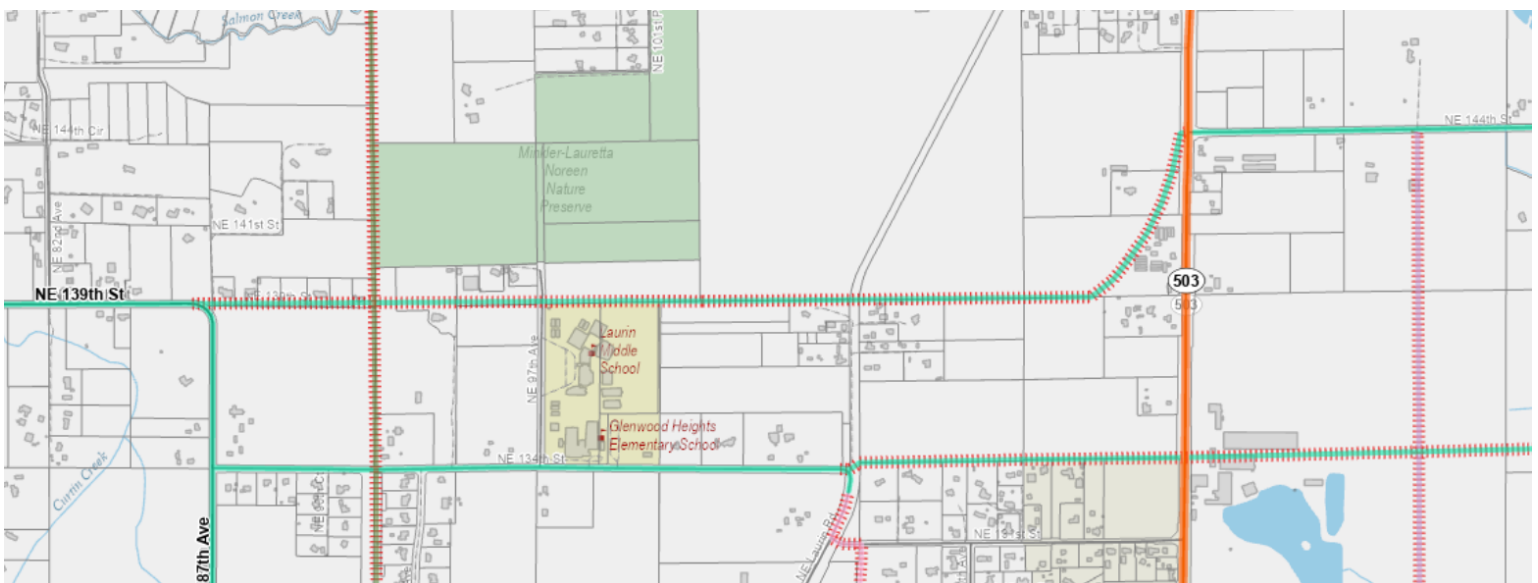
This memo outlines requested map corrections to the Clark County Arterial Atlas to address identified alignment issues. The purpose of these updates is to improve map accuracy and ensure the atlas reflects the correct street information for review and future use.

- NE 107th Avenue from 99th Street to 134th Street

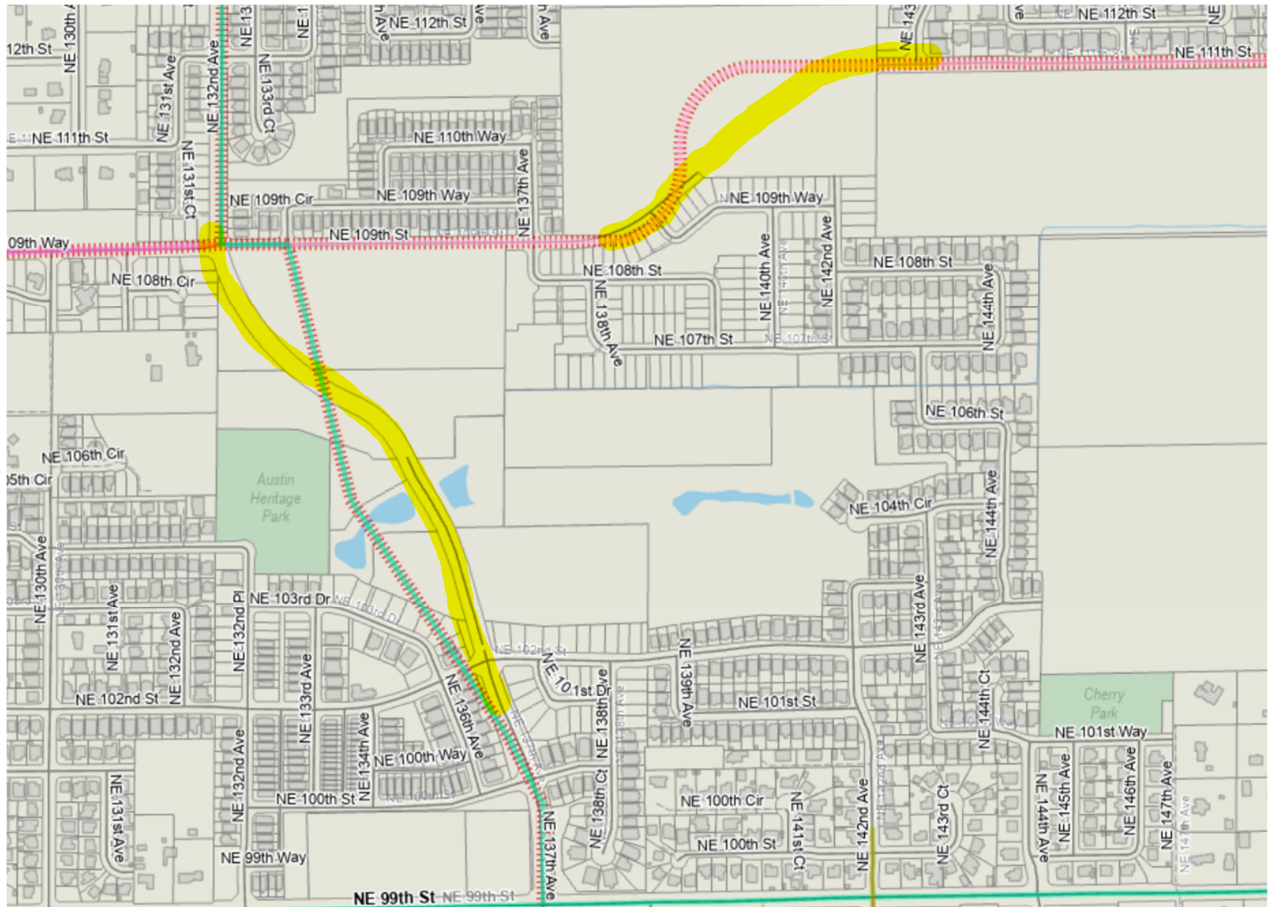




- NE 139th/144th Street alignment at intersection with SR503



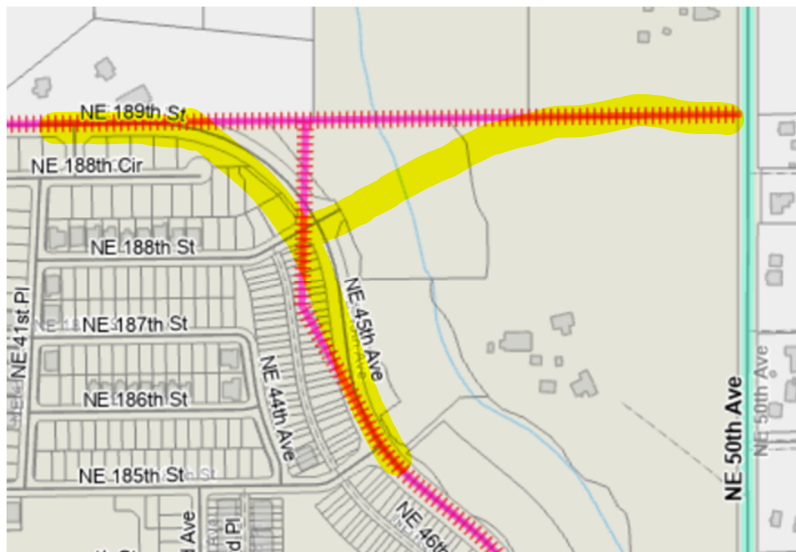
- NE 132nd/137th Avenue from 100th Street to 109th Street

- Remove Neighborhood Circulator/Commercial-Industrial street classified streets from Arterial Atlas (Suggestion to add layer to GIS to show streets with these classifications but ensure there is flexibility in location/alignment to meet project needs/constraints)
- General updates to Arterial Atlas to reflect existing street alignments
